**Whole school reminder:** As the weather is so changeable, please ensure your child continues to come to school in appropriate uniform and footwear (see below for full details), *all clearly named*:

- Football boots/alternative trainers must be worn for girls' football lunchtime club due to the current muddy conditions
- Children should wear their usual black or blue school shoes/trainers at all other times (sandals can be worn in the Summer months but no Crocs/equivalent please)
- Children should have their hair tied back if it reaches their shoulders
- Warm (preferably waterproof) coat with hat/scarf/gloves
- Wellies may be also needed depending upon the weather forecast
- Suncream should be applied at home in the mornings please do not send children in with suncream bottles

### Attendance and Punctuality



In August 2024, the Government published the statutory guidance on attendance (see link below). As per the guidance, parents and carers are expected to:

Ensure their child attends every day the school is open except when a statutory reason applies; Notify the school as soon as possible when their child has to be unexpectedly absent (e.g. sickness); Only request leave of absence in exceptional circumstances and do so in advance; Book any medical appointments around the school day where possible.

If you have any queries, please do let me know and you can read the guidance here:

Please ensure your child arrives at school on time - the gates open at 8.40am and close at 8.50am. Any child arriving after this time must be signed in at the School Office, as per our health and safety and attendance policies.

### Trips and Enrichment Activities

### Reminder - school uniform



#### Western Road Community Primary School's Uniform consists of:

- Navy school fleece with school logo (optional but these are very warm and ideal for Winter and Spring)
- Navy school jumper with or without school logo or navy or mid-grey cardigan
- White shirt/blouse with long or short sleeves with or without logo or
- White or navy blue polo shirt with or without school logo
- Mid-grey or navy trousers or smart shorts, or
- Mid-grey or navy skirts (or skorts), pinafore dresses or school summer dresses (blue/white check)
- White/navy/grey socks or tights
- Plain black or navy school shoes (or plain black or navy trainers with no logos); plain sandals in the Summer terms only (not Crocs or similar).
- Plain hair accessories (optional and in school colours preferably). Long hair (past shoulder length) must be tied back.

PE kit:

- White T-shirt or polo shirt with school logo (or plain)
- Grey or navy shorts or jogging bottoms (plain with no logos)
- Trainers or plimsolls

## Please note, hoodies and jewellery (apart from a wristwatch when appropriate or stud earrings that can be taken out for PE) are not part of the school uniform and must not be worn in school.

The school also has school caps, rucksacks and book bags available. Please ensure all items of clothing are named including shoes or trainers.

Second-hand items are regularly available at low cost at school fairs and events.

### Reminder - Message from the Bursar, Sarah Clifford

Please ensure your ParentPay accounts for dinner money are cleared at the end of each week, or (ideally) are in credit by a small amount. School dinners cost £2.97 per day for children in Years 3 - 6.

Children under 5 are entitled to free school milk each day, given at morning snack time (this is in addition to milk given to children who have school lunches). If you would like your child to receive milk, either as they are under 5 or at an additional cost, please do visit <u>https://www.coolmilk.com/parents/</u> for more information and to register your child.

If you think your child might be entitled to **Free School Meals** (regardless of their age) through the **Pupil Premium Grant**, please do look at <u>https://www.eastsussex.gov.uk/education-learning/schools/school-life/school-meals/free-school-meals</u> for more information. If your child is entitled to Free School Meals and/or the Pupil Premium Grant, the school will receive additional funding to support them with their learning and enrichment activities.

All school trips and school-run clubs (for example Sewing Club) through Arbor so please do make sure you are able to login. We will continue to use ParentPay for Chartwells payments.

News from Cherry Class (Year 2)



Before the holidays, Year 2 made the most of the beautiful weather, spending plenty of time outdoors in our school's outdoor area and on the field. In science, they explored different types of bridges. The children experimented with paper to make it stronger and worked collaboratively to build bridges out of

lollipop sticks. It was wonderful to see how well they cooperated and organised themselves, delegating tasks within their teams to complete their projects.

Our recent unit on multiplication and division has come to an end and I have sent home the children's TTRockstar logins so they can continue practising at home if they wish.

The Year 2 team has been particularly impressed with the children's confidence last term. Many students stepped out of their comfort zones to present their school council speeches and talent show performances. They all showed incredible sportsmanship, being gracious when others were chosen. We are so proud of every child for giving it their all and demonstrating such a positive attitude!

### News from Larch Class (Year 3)



Before the Easter break, Year 3 had a fantastic experience with Mr Gilmore from Sussex Music. He came in to teach an African drumming workshop to Larch Class where we played various styles of African drums to explore different rhythms, dynamics and pulse. It was greatly enjoyed by Larch Class and they were all so proud to show off their skills in a special assembly to the whole school.

### News from Willow Class (Year 4)



Year 4 have been getting creative with their learning this week! In Computing, they used stop-motion animation to recreate the dramatic eruption of Mount Vesuvius, bringing this historic event to life with their own storytelling and digital skills.

In Music, they explored how sound can shape a story by composing a music to accompany the book *Escape from Pompeii*. They focused on pulse and repeating rhythms using a range of instruments to build atmosphere, crafting sections that created a sense of calm before shifting to moments of danger. It was a fantastic cross-curricular project which showcased their imagination and musical talents.

They have been combining history and hands-on learning in their latest DT project too! As part of their Roman topic, they have designed and built their own catapults, exploring how these ancient siege weapons were used in battle. The children tested their creations, measuring how far they could launch projectiles and discussing the forces at play. They also evaluated their catapults and suggested how they could improve their designs in future. A fantastic way to bring history to life—well done, Year 4!

We've started the term with our exciting new topic: The Battle of Lewes, and it's already captured our imaginations—many of us have even chosen sides between King Henry III and Simon de Montfort!

As part of our learning, we visited the Priory Ruins, as a primary history source. We had a fantastic time exploring the remains of the once-great Lewes Priory, imagining what it would have looked like in medieval times. It was fascinating to see where the monks lived, worked, and worshipped. We were amazed to learn that the priory had 59 toilets, yet the monks only bathed twice a year—much to the children's amusement!

We also discovered that the ruins played a significant role in the Battle of Lewes in 1264, as some of the conflict took place there. It gave us a real sense of how the town's history is deeply connected to this important event. Standing on the very ground where soldiers once marched and fired flaming arrows made the battle feel much more real and meaningful.

It's been a brilliant start to the topic, and we're looking forward to uncovering more medieval mysteries in the weeks ahead!

### News from Elder Class (Year 5)

During Term 4, we learned about Judaism in Year 5 and on Monday, 31st March we went on a visit to the Brighton and Hove Reform Synagogue. It was a great morning out and we were warmly welcomed by the volunteers at the synagogue, who showed us around. It was really exciting to see in real life the things we had found out about at school, including the Torah Scrolls, the Ark with inscriptions of the Ten Commandments, the Yad (pointing stick), and some hanukkiahs (special candles for the Hanukah festival). We also enjoyed admiring the beautiful stained-glass windows that showed many of the stories from the Torah (Jewish Bible). We even learned some words of Hebrew!

The children had some wonderful questions and they really impressed our tour guides with all of their knowledge about the Jewish faith.

Year 5 have started Term 5 brilliantly and we are already immersed in all the learning around our Rivers topic. In English we are reading the novel "Journey to the River Sea" by Eva Ibbotson, about a girl called Maia living in 1910, who travels from London to a remote part of the Brazilian Amazon, to stay with her distant cousins. Unfortunately, the Carter family don't seem to be quite what she had hoped for! This week we have been getting into character and writing letters home to England, describing the journey, the strict Governess, and the "beastly" twin cousins. Next week we will pick one of the other characters in the story and write a diary entry from their perspective. Well done Year 5 we are so proud of your hard work in English!

Before the Easter break, we celebrated the 80th anniversary of VE Day with a VE party as part of our topic on WWII. We showed off our WWII knowledge; performed the *Lambeth Walk* and the *Lindy Hop* and had a 'street party' on the field, complete with flags, bunting and lots of snacks!

### Patina Update



#### Patina Update for Year 6 Parents

There's lots coming up for our Year 6 children this year and it's time to get going with Patina fundraising and events. Here's what's happening so far:

Fundraising: each Year 6 child is targeted with raising £20 in any way that they find fun. A sponsored bike ride, a lemonade stand, a toy sale - anything goes. ### Reminder - football kits (Thursdays)

### Reminder: Child Protection and Safeguarding

At Western Road Community Primary, all staff take child protection and safeguarding children very seriously, both in person and online. All staff have been trained in Safeguarding and Child Protection. If you have any concerns about a child's well-being, bullying or e-safety, please contact the Designated Safeguarding Leads (DLSs): Mrs Hamilton or Mrs Wooler.

During Assemblies, we have reminded all children that if they are worried or anxious at any time, they can talk to any trusted adult in school and who the DSLs are too.

As a school we are also part of Operation Encompass which is a police and education early information safeguarding partnership enabling schools to offer immediate support to children experiencing domestic abuse. Operation Encompass ensures that there is a simple telephone call or notification to a school's trained Designated Safeguarding Lead /Officer (known as key Adult) prior to the start of the next school day after an incident of police attended domestic abuse where there are children related to either of the adult parties involved. Information is shared with a school's Key Adult (Designated Safeguarding Lead or Officer) prior to the start of the next school day after officers have attended a domestic abuse incident. This sharing of information enables appropriate support to be given, dependent upon the needs and wishes of the child.
