Language of a Geographer

Maps	A drawing of the shape and position of features of an area such as roads and buildings.
Direction	The position towards which someone or something moves or faces.
North South East West	The points of a compass showing the direction of something or someone.
Left Right Forward Back	Used to direct something or someone.
Landmarks	A building that is easily recognised, especially to judge where you are.
Human features	Features that have been built by humans e.g. buildings, train tracks, roads, pavement.
Physical Features	Features that are natural to the world around us. For example,. hills, mountains, rivers.
Weather Patterns	The conditions in the air above the earth, such as wind, rain or temperature.

Language of a Scientist

Materials	A physical substance that things are made from.
Flexible	Able to bend or be bent easily without breaking.
Waterproof	A piece of clothing that does not let the water through and keeps you dry.
Strong	Difficult to break or destroy.
